Basic Guide to competing in ANCCE

- All horses must be presented in the correct showing in-hand bridle (either chain or saretta)
- Mares 4 years + are allowed to be presented in a leather head collar.
- **Dress code for Morphology:** either traditional traje corto (country suit) or English riding attire (dark jacket, breeches, boots, hat, tie or stock).
- **Dress code for Functionality:** English riding attire as above
- All females are predominantly presented fully hogged with the option of leaving the forelock on. However, it is acceptable to show mares with mane – must not be plaited.
- All males to be presented with a loose mane and tail in Morphology and a plaited mane (long plait or ball plaits) in the Functionality. Plaited tails are optional.

## Tails

Yearlings: male & female	Completely hogged
2- & 3-year-old fillies	Hogged at the top and cut to length accordingly
2- & 3-year-old colts	Natural
All mares	Hogged at the top and cut to length accordingly
All stallions and geldings	Natural

- Scores for all fillies, colts and mares are 100% from morphology. Mares can opt to compete in the Functionality, but it doesn't contribute to their overall score. However, her score will be eligible for the Best Functionality in her relevant class.
- Scores for all stallions and geldings are 75% from Morphology and 25% from functionality
- The 4-year-old functionality test only can be ridden with a whip (1.2m max length)

## Bits for functionality

4-year-olds	snaffle bridles only
5- & 6-year-olds	snaffle or double
7+ years old	snaffle or double

- Once all horses are present in the arena and the arena has been closed, the preview lap shall start. Under the judge's criteria, all of the horses shall proceed to perform, at walk, between one (1) and three (3) laps by competitor number.
- Horses shall exit the arena at walk, one by one from the closest end to their location. They shall walk down the centre line of the arena and once they have reached the end, they shall perform at least three (3) laps at canter and afterwards they shall trot to the other end of the arena, also along the centre line. Upon reaching the end, horse and presenter shall turn around and return to the centre of the arena in trot where they halt.
- Presenters have a limited amount of time, two (2) minutes and fifteen (15) seconds, to present their horses in movement.
- In the functionality test the judge shall assess the horse's natural paces, walk, trot and canter, scoring aspects such as mechanics, rhythm, easiness, impulsion and execution of good balance. Horses shall demonstrate the good handling or submission during the test. No penalties shall be given for mistakes by the rider; however, the rider must perform the specific figures for each test. Should there be a mistake while performing the test, the judge may stop the participation and indicate how the rider should continue. Three (3) or more mistake during the test shall result in elimination.
- ANCCE Rules & Regulations stipulate that all horses competing in Morphology classes must arrive the day before the competition starts (Thursday) and cannot leave the competition until after the Special Awards have been judged on Saturday.
- All Youngstock and Mare classes will be presented with their prizes when judged. Stallions and Geldings will firstly be judged for Morphology on Friday, and then on Saturday morning they are given a time for their Functionality test (20 x 60 arena). You do not need to enter them separately. Please enter the relevant Morphology class. When all the horses have completed the Functionality, they then return, in their relevant class, back into the arena in in-hand bridles for their prize giving.
- In every class there is a Best Movement and a Best British Bred. In addition, in each stallion and gelding class there is a Best Functionality.
- A copy of your score sheet will be available from the secretaries' desk at lunch time for the morning classes and tea-time for the afternoon classes.
